Plan Change 71 -

1. Amend the first paragraph as follows:



Under the Resource Management Act 1991 (Act) regional councils are able to charge for the occupation of the coastal marine area (CMA). Coastal occupation charges cannot be imposed unless the charge is provided for in the regional coastal plan and ensure that private occupation of this public land is recognised, with the loss of public benefit adequately accounted and provided for. The funds raised by such charges can be used not only to mitigate, remedy or otherwise manage the actual or cumulative effects of activities in the area but also in the wider environment (a public benefit). There is no inherent right to occupy public space in the CMA: however, coastal occupation charges must not be imposed on a protected customary rights group or customary marine title group exercising a right under Part 3 of the Marine and Coastal Area (Takutai Moana) Act 2011.

Continue with the second and following paragraphs.

Reason for relief sought: Emphasis needs to be added to ensure that the "cost" of occupation of public space for private benefit is recognised. We note that Southland Regional Council continues to charge coastal occupation charges as these were carried over from legislation prior to the Resource Management Act, the Harbours Act. It appears that most councils throughout the country have failed also to accept this cost to the public, but have bowed to commercial and private pressure.

2. Schedule of Amendments



Replace under the heading Coastal Occupation Charges the words "common marine and coastal area" with "coastal marine area"

Reason for the relief sought: due to the uncertainties associated with the Marine and Coastal Area (Takutai Moana) Act 2011 where land titles extend into the CMA, for future clarity and preciseness it is best to ensure that the phrase "coastal marine area" which is specific to the Resource Management Act as well as, importantly in this case, the New Zealand Coastal Policy Statement, be used. Additionally as coastal occupation charges must not be imposed on a protected customary rights group or customary marine title group exercising a right under Part 3 of the Marine and Coastal Area (Takutai Moana) Act 2011 (RMA section 64A(4)), the use of phrase here is confusing.

IN REGARDS TO PROPOSED PLAN CHANGES.

Having read through the proposed changes & after our joint committee meeting with you & other TDC representatives last Monday 20th July, we would like to make the following submissions.

<u>PLAN CHANGE 71.</u> Coastal Occupation Charges. We are in favour of the proposed changes.



PLAN CHANGE 72. Moorings and Coastal Structures.

We are in favour of the majority of the proposed changes.

It is important that Moorings and Structures be legalised and consented,

We agree that all users and owners of Moorings and Structures be identified.

Those who are identified that currently have unconsented moorings or structures, should have the opportunity to legalise them.

After given a reasonable chance to do so, and haven't taken the opportunity, the unconsented mooring or structure should be removed.

We Agree with the Proposal in relation to C72 S32

Page 34 9.1.10. Mooring and Structures.

That the Management Plan considers that Moorings adjoining Private Land and Settlements is appropriate.

11.6 Facilities and Structures.

Those Structures at Torrent Bay that comply with the relevant provisions of the Plan should be legalised.

- 5.1.1. We agree with Options 2,6,7,10.
- 5.1.4. We agree with Options 2 & 3.
- 5.1.5. We agree with Options 2& 3.
- **<u>5.2.1.</u>** We agree with Options 2.

We specially agree with Option 6. That it would be possible to establish Methods of Self Management.

However, the rest of our submission, will mainly comment on the proposed changes etc. which are relative to Torrent Bay.

Glasgow Bay and Torrent Bay Estuary Lagoon.

Only those with invested interests in Land Title at Torrent Bay or Glasgow Bay and to the extent that the cumulative effect of Moorings or Structures at each location is not adverse,

In regards to Glasgow Bay.

Almost all the present moorings have Resource Consents. Therefore not a problem. Any others should be removed.

In regards to Torrent Bay Estuary Lagoon.

- 1. The present Main Jetty and small Boat Ramp have Resource Consents. So no problem.
- 2. Regarding the Finger Jetty.

 We agree with the Proposed Plan Change that the Finger Jetty becomes a Permitted Activity.
- 3. In regards to the present Pole Mooring Structures. We support the retention of these. The 2 local launches that use them, have owned and maintained them for many years. Both are adjoining Torrent Bay Property owners.

 Both have consented Moorings in Glasgow Bay.

 However, Glasgow Bay is not an all- weather safe mooring area. Therefore in conditions of hazardous and dangerous weather and seas in Glasgow Bay, both of these launches need to be able to go into the safe sheltered area of Torrent Bay Estuary Lagoon. Because this type of boat cannot rest on the bottom unaided at low tide, they need Pole Structures to hold them safely upright.

Both Structures have been there for 50+ years. Being located where they are, they have no adverse effect for other Residents activities, being either, boating and anchoring, Kayaking, Swimming, or the general use of that area to the General Public. They are situated well away from the busy general use areas around the Main Jetty and where most other Residents park their boats.

At this year's Torrent Bay Township Committees AGM, a motion was passed by the Residents, that approved & endorsed the continued present use, and interests of these current 2 Structures in their present form and location.

THE TORRENT BAY TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE, ON BEHALF OF THE RESIDENTS, WOULD LIKE TO BE ABLE TO SET UP SELF MANAGEMENT, FOR GLASGOW BAY AND TORRENT BAY ESTUARY LAGOON, INCLUDING LOCATIONS, SIZE OF BOATS AND TYPE OF MOORINGS AND STRUCTURES.



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It appears that the Council has already decided not to charge for the occupation of space within the coastal marine area. I am uncertain, therefore, of the purpose of this supposed consultation.

Charging is a principal means of managing any limited resource, as any economist will tell you and as the Council apparently recognises, and it is extraordinary that the Council should decide not to use it (I note the excuse offered in the Explanatory Statement). It appears that people holding mooring licences are being subsidized by the rest of the community of ratepayers. A mooring occupies approximately 1,200 sq metres of seabed (assuming a 10 m craft and a 10 m mooring line, giving a swinging circle of 20 m radius). I pay over \$4,000 p.a. rates for my 809 sq metre section (plus dwelling), as a contribution to TDC functions. Why should not a mooring occupier similarly pay a contribution, most obviously to the not inconsiderable cost of the Harbourmaster's operations?

The consequence of not charging for moorings is already apparent offshore from Trewavas Street Reserve (the proposed mooring area Motueka 2). There are several unused, derelict, unsightly boats moored here, and there is no incentive for the owners to dispose of them properly when they are not charged for the privilege (sic) of mooring these boats (I note that these moorings are, I understand, unconsented).

The wording of para 3 of the section "Coastal Occupation Charges" is unacceptably vague: "Until such a time that a charging regime is included in the Plan,..." Given that the section itself recognizes the importance of a charging regime, I would expect that the Council would commit itself to a timeline for developing and introducing a charging regime.

Sanford has an aquaculture business in Taman Region where we farm Greenshell mussels.

Proposed Plan Change 71

Sanford supports the Council not charging for use of the coastal marine area until all uncertainties are resolved. Sanford signals our desire to be involved in the consultation and engagement processes in the early development of this policy.

Submission: Support the Plan Change 71 in its entirety

Relief: No further action required.

Proposed Plan Change 72

Sanford owns mussel farm barges that have their home port as Havelock. Sanford vessels are unlikely to use public use swing moorings. Sanford hires temporary berthing facilities at Tarakohe on an asneeded basis.

Mussel farming is a consented activity. The conditions of the consent include the use of navigation marks and buoys, these moorings are for public awareness and navigation safety. The use of these marks are required by Maritime New Zealand and the Council, moorings are installed under the direction / approval of the Tasman Harbour Master. These moorings are required as part of the farm layout plan submitted and approved with the resource consent.

Submission – Amend the planning provisions so that moorings associated with aquaculture activities are specifically exempt from Plan Change 72.

Reason for our submission - Sanford understands the purpose of the Plan Change 72 is to provide for public and private moorings at permitted mooring areas for recreational and commercial 'trailer' boats. The s32 analysis is silent in respect to aquaculture vessels.

Relief sought - Exclude from Plan Change moorings associated with aquaculture activities.

We agree that all users and owners of Moorings and Structures be identified.

Those who are identified that currently have unconsented moorings or structures, should have the opportunity to legalise them.

After given a reasonable chance to do so, and haven't taken the opportunity, the unconsented mooring or structure should be removed.

We Agree with the Proposal in relation to C72 S32

<u>Page 34</u> <u>9.1.10.</u> Mooring and Structures.

That the Management Plan considers that Moorings adjoining Private Land and Settlements is appropriate.

11.6 Facilities and Structures.

Those Structures at Torrent Bay that comply with the relevant provisions of the Plan should be legalised.

- 5.1.1. We agree with Options 2,6,7,10.
- 5.1.4. We agree with Options 2 & 3.

We specially agree with Option 6. That it would be possible to establish Methods of Self Management.

However, the rest of our submission, will mainly comment on the proposed changes etc. which are relative to Torrent Bay.

Glasgow Bay and Torrent Bay Estuary Lagoon.

Only those with invested interests in Land Title at Torrent Bay or Glasgow Bay and to the extent that the cumulative effect of Moorings or Structures at each location is not adverse,

In regards to Glasgow Bay.

Almost all the present moorings have Resource Consents. Therefore not a problem. Any others should be removed.

In regards to Torrent Bay Estuary Lagoon.

- 1. The present Main Jetty and small Boat Ramp have Resource Consents. So no problem.
- 2. Regarding the Finger Jetty.

 We agree with the Proposed Plan Change that the Finger Jetty becomes a Permitted Activity.
- 3. In regards to the present Pole Mooring Structures. We support the retention of these. The 2 local launches that use them, have owned and maintained them for many years. Both are adjoining Torrent Bay Property owners.

 Both have consented Moorings in Glasgow Bay.

 However, Glasgow Bay is not an all- weather safe mooring area. Therefore in conditions of hazardous and dangerous weather and seas in Glasgow Bay, both of these launches need to be able to go into the safe sheltered area of Torrent Bay Estuary Lagoon. Because this type of boat cannot rest on the bottom unaided at low tide, they need Pole Structures to hold them safely upright.

Both Structures have been there for 50+ years. Being located where they are, they have no adverse effect for other Residents activities, being either, boating and anchoring, Kayaking, Swimming, or the general use of that area to the General Public. They are situated well away from the busy general use areas around the Main Jetty and where most other Residents park their boats.

At this year's Torrent Bay Township Committees AGM, a motion was passed by the Residents, that approved & endorsed the continued present use, and interests of these current 2 Structures in their present form and location.

THE TORRENT BAY TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE, ON BEHALF OF THE RESIDENTS, WOULD LIKE TO BE ABLE TO SET UP SELF MANAGEMENT, FOR GLASGOW BAY AND TORRENT BAY ESTUARY LAGOON, INCLUDING LOCATIONS, SIZE OF BOATS AND TYPE OF MOORINGS AND STRUCTURES.

Whilst broadly supporting the proposed changes, the Marine Farming Association requests that the following points be considered:

- 1) That flexibility be retained in the designation of Mooring Areas to allow for future development of critical port/marina infrastructure.
- 2) That 'mooring' be added to the 'defined words' and it be made abundantly clear that a 'mooring' is not a marine farm anchor or any other component part of marine farm infrastructure.
- 3) That a schedule for periodic surveying of Mooring Areas for marine pests be developed in conjunction with the Top of the South Biosecurity Partnership.
